Fact Sheet: U.S. Army North COVID-19 Hospital Support from August 2021 to March 2022

This fact sheet reflects a joint military operation that began August 2021 and is part of the whole-of-government response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since August 2021, approximately 1,275 military medical personnel from the U.S. Army, U.S. Air Force and U.S. Navy have worked alongside civilian healthcare providers in civilian hospitals, helping treat COVID-19 patients in a total of 30 states and the Navajo Nation.

A breakdown of military assistance during this period is below.

U.S. Army North, U.S. Northern Command's Joint Force Land Component Command, manages the Department of Defense's COVID-19 response operation in support of the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Department of Health and Human Services.

Completed Support:

Approximately 1,275 military medical personnel have completed support to 62 hospitals in 59 cities in 30 states and the Navajo Nation.

Alabama

In Alabama, two teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel, one from the U.S. Air Force and one from the U.S. Navy, supported the state at two hospitals in two cities:

- The team from the U.S. Air Force supported Southeast Health in Dothan, from Aug. 29 to Oct. 27, 2021
- The team from U.S. Navy supported Dale Medical Center in Ozark, from Sep. 8 to Nov. 7, 2021

Arizona

In Arizona, three teams of approximately 15 military medical personnel, one from the U.S. Air Force and two from the U.S. Navy, supported the state at three hospitals in three cities:

- The team from the U.S. Air Force supported Yuma Regional Medical Center in Yuma, from Jan. 1 to Mar. 8
- One team from the U.S. Navy supported Canyon Vista Medical Center in Sierra Vista, from Feb. 16 to Mar. 16
- The other team from the U.S. Navy supported Valleywise Health Medical Center in Phoenix, from Feb. 19 to Mar. 20

Arkansas

In Arkansas, one team of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Army supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Little Rock, from Sep. 10 to Oct. 11, 2021

California

In California, one team of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- Emanate Health Queen of the Valley Hospital in West Covina, from Feb. 7 to Mar. 8

Colorado

In Colorado, one team of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- UCHealth Poudre Valley Hospital in Fort Collins, from Nov. 25 to Dec. 23, 2021

In Colorado, one monoclonal antibody infusion team of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- Denver Health – Federico F. Peña Southwest Family Health Center and Urgent Care in Denver, from Dec. 11, 2021 to Jan. 9

Connecticut

In Connecticut, three teams of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at three hospitals in two cities:

- Yale New Haven Hospital in New Haven, from Feb. 11 to Mar. 11
- Saint Francis Hospital in Hartford, from Feb. 13 to Mar. 14
- Hartford Hospital in Hartford, from Feb. 15 to Mar. 16

Idaho

In Idaho, one team of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Army supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- Kootenai Health in Coeur d'Alene, from Sep. 7 to Dec. 6, 2021

Indiana

In Indiana, one team of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Navy supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- Indiana University Health Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis, from Dec. 24, 2021 to Feb. 21

Louisiana

In Louisiana, three teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel, two from the U.S. Air Force and one team from the U.S. Navy, and two teams of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at four hospitals in four cities:

- The team from the U.S. Navy supported Ochsner Lafayette General Medical Center in Lafayette, from Aug. 20 to Oct. 19, 2021
- One team from the U.S. Air Force supported Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center in Baton Rouge, from Aug. 26 to Oct. 25, 2021
- The other team from the U.S. Air Force supported Rapides Regional Medical Center in Alexandria, from Aug. 30 to Oct. 29, 2021
- The two teams from the U.S. Air Force supported St. Francis Medical Center in Monroe, from Feb. 9 to Mar. 10

Maine

In Maine, three teams of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at two hospitals in two cities:

- One team supported Central Maine Medical Center in Lewiston, from Feb. 1 to Mar. 1
- Two teams supported Northern Light Eastern Maine Medical Center in Bangor, from Feb. 19 to Mar. 20

Maryland

In Maryland, one team of approximately 40 military medical personnel from the U.S. Navy supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- Adventist HealthCare Alternate Care Site in Takoma Park, from Feb. 4 to Mar. 5

Massachusetts

In Massachusetts, two teams of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at two hospitals in two cities:

- Lawrence General Hospital in Lawrence, from Feb. 13 to Mar. 14
- Signature Healthcare Brockton Hospital in Brockton, from Feb. 15 to Mar. 16

Michigan

In Michigan, five teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Army and one team of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at six hospitals in six cities:

- One team from the U.S. Army supported Beaumont Hospital in Dearborn, from Dec. 4, 2021 to Feb. 1
- The second team from the U.S. Army supported Spectrum Health Butterworth Hospital in Grand Rapids, from Dec. 6, 2021 to Feb. 3

- The team from the U.S. Air Force supported Mercy Health in Muskegon, from Jan. 2 to Jan. 31
- The third team from the U.S. Army supported Henry Ford Wyandotte Hospital in Wyandotte, from Jan. 24 to Feb. 22
- The fourth team from the U.S. Army supported Covenant Medical Center Harrison in Saginaw, from Dec. 12, 2021 to Feb. 23
- The fifth team from the U.S. Army supported Sparrow Hospital in Lansing, from Feb. 8 to Mar. 9

Minnesota

In Minnesota, three teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel, two from the U.S. Air Force and one from the U.S. Army, supported the state at three hospitals in two cities:

- One team from the U.S. Air Force supported Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis, from Nov. 25, 2021 to Jan. 21
- The other team from the U.S. Air Force supported Providence St. Patrick Hospital in St. Cloud, from Nov. 29, 2021 to Jan. 27
- The team from the U.S. Army supported Abbott Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis, from Feb. 1 to Mar. 16

Mississippi

In Mississippi, two teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel, one from the U.S. Army and one from the U.S. Air Force, supported the state at two hospitals in two cities:

- The team from the U.S. Air Force supported University of Mississippi Medical Center in Jackson, from Aug. 23 to Oct. 20, 2021
- The team from the U.S. Army supported North Mississippi Medical Center-Tupelo in Tupelo, from Aug. 27 to Oct. 23, 2021

Missouri

In Missouri, one team of approximately 40 military medical personnel from the U.S. Navy supported the state at one hospital in one city:

Montana

- One team supported San Juan Regional Medical Center in Farmington, from Dec. 6, 2021 to Jan. 4, while another team supported the same hospital, from Dec. 9, 2021 to Feb. 4.
- A third team supported University of New Mexico Hospital in Albuquerque, from Jan. 23 to Mar. 7

New York

In New York, three teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel, two from the U.S. Army and one from the U.S. Navy, along with four teams of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force, supported the state at five hospitals in five cities:

- One team from the U.S. Army supported Coney Island Hospital in Brooklyn, from Jan. 24 to Feb. 22
- The other team from the U.S. Army supported North Central Bronx Hospital in Bronx, from Jan. 31 to Feb. 26
- The team from the U.S. Navy supported Erie County Medical Center in Buffalo, from Jan. 10 to Mar. 10
- Two teams from the U.S. Air Force supported State University of New York (SUNY) Upstate Medical University Hospital in Syracuse, from Feb. 11 to Mar. 12
- The other two teams from the U.S. Air Force supported University of Rochester Medical Center – Strong Memorial Hospital in Rochester, from Feb. 16 to Mar. 16

Ohio

In Ohio, two teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel, one from the U.S. Air Force and one from the U.S. Army, supported the state at two hospitals in two cities:

- The team from the U.S. Air Force supported Cleveland Clinic in Cleveland, from Jan. 21 to Feb. 19

- The team from the U.S. Army supported Summa Health System – Akron Campus in Akron, from Feb. 1 to Mar. 2

Oklahoma

In Oklahoma, two teams of approximately 15 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force and one team of approximately 20 from the U.S. Army supported the state at two hospitals in one city:

- The team from the U.S. Army supported OU Health – University of Oklahoma Medical Center in Oklahoma City, from Feb. 7 to Mar. 9
- The two teams from the U.S. Air Force supported Integris Baptist Medical Center in Oklahoma City, from Feb. 9 to Mar. 10

Pennsylvania

In Pennsylvania, two teams of approximately 15-20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Air Force supported the state at two hospitals in two cities:

- The team of 20 supported WellSpan Surgery & Rehabilitation Hospital in York, from Jan. 3 to Mar. 3
- The team of 15 supported Regional Hospital of Scranton in Scranton, from Jan. 4 to Mar. 4

In Utah, one team of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Navy supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- University of Utah Hospital in Salt Lake City, from Mar. 5 to Mar. 29

Washington

In Washington, two teams of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Navy supported the state at two hospitals in two cities:

- Providence Sacred Heart Medical Center in Spokane, from Oct. 19 to Nov. 17, 2021
- Confluence Health in Wenatchee, from Oct. 20 to Nov. 22, 2021

Wisconsin

In Wisconsin, one team of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Navy supported the state at one hospital in one city:

- Bellin Hospital in Green Bay, from Dec. 30, 2021 to Feb. 27

Navajo Nation

In the Navajo Nation, one team of approximately 20 military medical personnel from the U.S. Army supported the Native American territory in one hospital in one city in one state:

- Northern Navajo Medical Center in Shiprock, New Mexico, from Jan. 26 to Feb. 27
