Medical Support

- Military medical support covers a range of treatment from routine to emergency medical care
- At the request of FEMA, DoD has expanded its medical support to include treating COVID-19 positive patients in some communities.
- Force health protection is a top priority
- Our medical professionals will have the training and personal protective equipment to safely carryout this crucial mission
- Our focus is on protecting our people so they can continue helping the American people.

Types of Medical Support

- **Army Hospital Centers and Field Hospitals**
 - Full hospital capability including intensive and intermediate care beds
 - Routine and emergency medical support
 - Operating rooms, emergency department, X-ray facility, and pharmacies

- **Expeditionary Medical Support System (U.S. Air Force)**

- Modular field hospital which includes staff and equipment
- Can be deployed and set up in any location

- **Expeditionary Medical Facility (U.S. Navy)**

- Designed to treat combat patients
- Personnel including physicians, nurses, and other medical professionals
- Medical care from emergency medicine to acute medical and surgical

- **Urban Augmentation Medical Task Force (U.S. Army)**

- Healthcare workers who can be rapidly deployed to fill staffing gaps in urban areas
